MINUTES BOARD OF FINANCE SPECIAL MEETING, OXFORD TOWN HALL AUGUST 29, 2016 – 7:00 P.M.

Present: Chairman Jack Kiley; Tom Kelly; Sue Arpin; Robert DeBisschop; Lila Ferrillo; Dana Flach. Also present: James Hliva, Finance Director.

Also present: First Selectman George Temple; Selectman Mr. Jeff Haney; Madalene Taggart; Scott Halstead; Bob Farnum.

The Special Meeting was opened at 7:00 p.m. by Chairman Jack Kiley. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

3) Approve additional appropriation in the amount of \$34,048.00 for the purchase of a new ambulance. (Town Meeting approval required)

Mr. Kiley made a Motion to move this Item #3 concerning the purchase of a new ambulance, to #12 as Jerry Schwab will not arrive at the meeting until 8:00 p.m. Mr. Kelly seconded the Motion; a vote was taken.

4) Approve appropriation in an amount not to exceed \$75,000 for WPCA corrosion evaluation study. (Town Meeting approval required)

Mr. DeBisschop made a Motion to discuss this item; Mr. Kelly seconded the Motion. All in favor. This was for discussion.

Mr. Kiley introduced Mr. Bob Farnum as a new addition to the WPCA Board. He is retired from Yankee Gas and has 40 years' experience. Mr. Farnum may be able to determine a better way to investigate and repair the leak at Towner Lane. Scott Halstead gave a recap of the issue from last year's sewer line break. The Commission feels there is a better way to prevent future problems and they have a company to perform a review for \$75,000. Mr. Farnum spoke to the issue. The purpose of the survey would be to try to determine where the worst corrosion is without digging. He described what would occur after the results of the study are released and the equipment/software that would be needed. Mr. Kelly described videos that he had seen which described alternative methods for repairs of the pipe. Mr. Farnum spoke to Mr. Kelly's

suggestions and an in-depth, lengthy explanation ensued. Mr. Halstead joined in the discussion regarding the reason for the pipe failing and why there may be future failings. Mr. Farnum passed out a few handouts which described how the survey/review would proceed.

Mr. Hliva made a recommendation with regard to funding this survey to check if this survey would be payable under LoCIP; it probably is not. If that is the case, his alternative recommendation would be that the money comes from General Fund. If the study requires construction and replacement of pipe this would require a bond issue and the study be rolled into a bond issue.

Mr. Kiley made a Motion to approve \$75,000 to the WPCA for the study, with money coming from General Fund, or LoCIP if possible; if more money is required under the bond that this study be rolled into the bond. Mr. Kelly seconded the Motion. A vote was taken.

5) Approve appropriation of \$71,107.50 for School Security measures (2016-2017 fiscal year with funding from LoCIP. Town Meeting approval required)

Mr. Kelly recalled that this item was to be tabled until more information had been presented to Mr. Hliva. Mr. Kelly then made a Motion to table the item until such time as Mr. Hliva is in possession of more information for a cost analysis. Mr. Hliva described to other BOF members what occurred with this project. Mr. Flach seconded the Motion. A vote was taken.

6) Approve appropriation for police in the amount of \$504,954.23 to cover State Police salaries and benefits for 2015-2016 (Town Meeting approval required)

Mr. Kelly made a Motion to approve this appropriation for discussion. Mr. Kiley seconded the Motion.

Mr. Hliva began a lengthy description with regard to the need for this appropriation; after the budget approval, Governor Malloy cancelled the State Police 30% subsidy to the Town (\$250K-\$300K); two (2) local officers are out of work on Workers' Compensation. Two additional State Troopers were brought in to replace those two officers. Mr. Kelly asked Mr. Hliva why State Troopers are being utilized to cover those duties and Mr. Hliva said he could not answer that. Mr. Kelly would have to ask Sergeant Semosky. Ms. Ferrillo said she believed that the State Troopers are paid at straight time. Mr. Kelly pointed out that they are paid at 100% which is at or above the current cost. Mr. Kiley pointed out that the salaries of the out-of-work officers are covered by Workers' Compensation so there would be a gain.

A discussion was held among the BOF members and Mr. Hliva with regard to results and recommendations. Mr. Hliva noted that the State did not send this bill until after the budget was approved. This item will need to go to Town meeting.

Mr. Kelly made a Motion to approve this appropriation of \$504,954.23 to be taken out of General Fund. Mr. Kiley seconded the Motion. A vote was taken.

7) Approve transfer of \$4,762.00 from Contingency for additional costs on Lily Park cameras

Two boxes are needed which contain heating and air-conditioning to protect them from weather elements and these were not included. Mr. Haney responded to this discussion. One box has been installed by him on August 29, 2016. The box is installed but not connected. Mr. Haney is hoping both boxes will be installed and operating by the end of the week. An in-depth discussion began among the BOF members and Mr. Haney.

Mr. Kelly modified his Motion to approve taking the \$4,762.00 from Board of Finance Contingency; Ms. Arpin seconded the Motion. A vote was taken.

A lengthy discussion opened regarding **Item #3** with regard to <u>Wages Building Official</u> and the funding involved. There is protocol that needs to be followed with regard to funding requested increases.

9) Approve transfer approved by Selectmen on August 18, 2016 2015-2016 Fiscal Year (28) (SEE ATTACHED)

Mr. Hliva gave the explanation regarding **Item #1.** Employee's position was eliminated but the employee is on Workers' Compensation. As long as the person is on Workers' Compensation, Mr. Hliva must continue to pay benefits.

A discussion ensued regarding Item #3. Mr. Hliva described that the position has been made a union position. Ms. Ferrillo pointed out that the position was a Charter position at the pleasure of the Selectman and not a Union position. Mr. Temple noted that this issue will be resolved at the next Selectmen's meeting.

Item #25:

A question arose regarding the increase for the Web Site Coordinator. Position has not changed. Stipend is budgeted for 2016/2017. Mr. Hliva said \$300.00 per month stipend is paid for Web Site Coordinator.

Ms. Arpin asked if the transfer request could be divided and only increase custodian wage. She made her Motion accordingly.

Ms. Arpin then made the Motion to not approve Website Administrator increase; Mr. Kelly seconded the Motion.

A discussion ensued regarding the purpose of the Website Administrator. Mr. Temple advised if there are any issues, they should be presented to him.

Mr. Hliva discussed the Board of Finance Contingency Account analysis noting that after all transfers approved/tabled at this BOF meeting there is a balance in the Contingency Fund of \$38,507.64.

10) Discussion on Police Budget

Mr. Temple began a discussion on the hiring of two (2) new police officers. The Board of Selectmen will be voting at their next meeting. There seven (7) troopers presently, which is three (3) too many. There would then be four (4) troopers and eleven (11) Oxford police. If the count goes below four troopers, the Town would lose Sergeant Semosky. The BOS needs to decide which three will be released.

11) Discussion on the 2015-2016 Tax Collections

Mr. Kiley said there was a discussion was held with the Tax Collector. The Town is at 98% collections. Mr. Hliva said that Ms. Flach, Mr. Kiley and Mr. Hliva will meet with the Tax Collector the Friday before the BOF meetings.

12) (formerly Item #3) Approve additional appropriation in the amount of \$34,048.00 for the purchase of a new ambulance. (Town Meeting approval required)

Mr. Kiley reiterated the history of the purchase of the new ambulance and the issues associated with same. Ambulance is ready but is being held up pending receipt of extra funding. Also, the contract was made out to Oxford Ambulance Association. Contract needs to be amended to be between the Town of Oxford and the vendor since the Town will own the ambulance. Contract was signed on June 28, 2015.

Mr. Schwab disputed the history as reported by Mr. Kiley. Mr. Schwab said he never heard that there was ever a problem. Mr. Hliva said he had sent over the description of the vehicle to be purchased from Trumbull. Mr. Kelly asked why does OAA expect the Town to pay more when they already knew the Town would allocate \$170,000. Ambulance was being bought to replace, not to subsidize, the existing ambulance. It appears that there will now be three ambulances, instead of two.

Mr. Temple said he sees no reason for the Town to have three ambulances. He wants to see ambulance reports, showing calls, etc.

Ms. Flach asked Mr. Schwab where are the copies of monthly ambulance reports. BOS receives these reports every month for BOF does not. Mr. Temple said he does not see these reports. Mr. Kiley is insistent on seeing reports for increase for revenue.

Mr. Kiley asked Mr. Schwab where additional equipment would come from. Mr. Schwab said he has no need for additional equipment.

Mr. Haney produced documents with regard to the old ambulance showing expensive repairs made to the old ambulance.

A lengthy discussion (approximately 40 minutes) ensued among the Board of Finance members, Mr. Temple and Mr. Schwab. Mr. Kiley said the OAA has never appeared at a Budget presentation to his recollection. If no decision can be reached on financing, Board of Selectmen makes the final decision. BOS will instruct the Town attorney to change the contract. Mr. Temple will have the ambulance issue placed on the BOS agenda for their next meeting.

Mr. Kiley revised his Motion as follows:

Approve new ambulance purchase for additional \$34,048

Contract from vendor will be in the name of the Town of Oxford; Town of Oxford will lease ambulance to OAA for \$1.00 per year. Town of Oxford and OAA will be on contract.

\$34,048 will come out of operating budget of OAA

Town will pay costs, insurance, etc. for ambulance

Disposition of third ambulance will be up to BOS to retire 3rd ambulance

BOF approval is contingent on BOS retiring 3rd ambulance

Mr. Hliva will establish two new accounts: (1) one called "Ambulance Purchase" and funded with \$34,048; and (2) one called "Classified from Oxford Ambulance Association" showing (\$34,048).

Mr. Kelly seconded this Motion. A vote was taken. All in favor – Mr. DeBisschop votes nay. The Motion passes.

Ms. Ferrillo made a Motion to put money into the Capital Plan during the next budget process for replacement of the 2008 ambulance.

Mr. Kelly seconded this Motion. A vote was taken. All in favor; Motion passes.

Mr. Kiley noted that this Motion needs to be requested by the Oxford Ambulance Association and presented by the Board of Selectmen.

There being no further discussion, Motion to adjourn was made by Ms. Flach, and seconded by Mr. Kelly. All in favor. Meeting was adjourned at 9:30 p.m.
