Board of Selectmen's Regular Meeting

Wednesday, March 2, 2016 7:30 PM - Town Hall

The meeting was called to order by First Selectman George Temple and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

ACCEPTANCE OF MINUTES

1. 2/17/16 Regular Meeting

MOTION:

Jeff Haney moved to approve the 2/17/16 Regular Meeting minutes as presented. This was seconded by Kathy Johnson. All 3 Ayes. Motion carries.

AMENDMENT OF AGENDA

1. Economic Development Commission Appointment

MOTION:

Jeff Haney moved to amend the agenda to add Economic Development Commission Appointment under Appointments. This was seconded by Kathy Johnson. All 3 Ayes. Motion carries.

APPOINTMENTS

1. Naugatuck Valley Regional Planning Commission – Appoint Tanya Carver

MOTION:

Jeff Haney moved to appoint Tanya Carver, of 1 Old Moose Hill Road, to the Naugatuck Valley Regional Planning Commission. This was seconded by Kathy Johnson. All 3 Ayes. Motion carries.

Discussion: Tanya Carver is very much interested in this and she will represent Oxford on this commission. This is a potential for good things for Oxford. Jeff Haney asked if

this was for the future planning of all the towns. First Selectman Temple stated it was a regional planning for all the towns up and down the Naugatuck River. The commission encourages buying land for a town's use.

2. Economic Development Commission Appointment

MOTION:

Jeff Haney moved to appoint Victor Tomporowski, of 20 Hawley Road, to the Economic Development Commission Appointment with a term to commence immediately and expire on 12/31/19. This was seconded by Kathy Johnson. All 3 Ayes. Motion carries.

Discussion: Mr. Tomporowski is very much interested in this and First Selectman Temple has talked with the Economic Development Commission, and feels it would be a good appointment.

NEW BUSINESS

1. FY 2016-2017 Town Operating Budget – Approve and Forward to Board of Finance

MOTION:

Jeff Haney moved to approve the FY 2016-2017 Town Operating Budget, with a total Municipal expenditure of \$15,109,331 plus \$734,000 for Road Improvements, and to forward this matter to the Board of Finance and then to Town Meeting. This was seconded by Kathy Johnson. All 3 Ayes. Motion carries.

Discussion: First Selectman Temple stated it is a good budget and we had many cuts in areas and additions in others. It will make the town run more efficiently. It is a 2.79% increase or \$415,851. Some things are very much needed. It reflects the increase in the State Police Department which is the major increase, plus an increase in medical insurance. First Selectman Temple stated he was pleased with all of the efforts from the Board of Selectmen and thanked them for their help. The decreases to help offset that are with the bonding debts because of the revenues from the cell tower phone leases. That money which was not used on Tetlak Park and wasn't used on the ball fields at the high school will be used to pay down on existing debt which will help with next year's budget. First Selectman George Temple stated we will have a few more positions, including a floater, especially since we are open on Friday's now who will work in various departments. In the Public Works Dept., we will add 2 people and we are still below what that department was twelve years ago. First Selectman Temple thanked everyone for their help with the budget.

2. Capital Improvement Plan – Approve and Forward to Town Meeting

MOTION:

Jeff Haney moved to approve the Capital Improvement Plan, as presented, and to forward this matter to a Town Meeting on Monday, March 14, 2016 per Town Charter. This was seconded by First Selectman George Temple. All 3 Ayes. Motion carries.

Discussion: This is another item that the Board of Selectmen hashed out, and we don't have to spend this money, but if we are going to attempt to do something, it has to be in this plan. Center School was reduced since it was a \$17,000,000 budget for redoing the school, and we are in the process of replacing it. Also, we have been notified that the town of Monroe has offered us a school to send our Center School children to, pending the construction of the new school. This will be communicated to the Board of Education. Some things are not included in this plan if we got no response from a particular department; we feel they are not interested in it.

3. Fire Fighters 2015 Certified Tax Abatements – Approve

MOTION:

Jeff Haney moved to approve the attached 2015 Fire Fighters Certified for Tax Abatements as presented by the Board of Chiefs in their letter dated 2/10/16. This was seconded by Kathy Johnson. All 3 Ayes. Motion carries.

Discussion: This is by ordinance, and it is one of the few benefits of being a fire fighter. First Selectman George Temple cheerfully supports this.

4. Easement Over Town-Owned Property Request – Discuss with Possible Action

Discussion:

Planning & Zoning Commission has requested this. We only have one member from that commission here, and at the last Planning & Zoning meeting it was approved by 6 Ayes, so we will support that Boards recommendation.

MOTION:

Jeff Haney moved to approve an easement over town-owned right-of-way located off of Perkins Road #2 in order for a driveway to be constructed at 66 Perkins Road; based on the documentation received from the Planning & Zoning Commission on 2/17/16. This was seconded by Kathy Johnson. All 3 Ayes. Motion carries.

5. Town Wide Cleanup Project – Approve Resolution and Authorize First Selectman to Sign

MOTION:

Jeff Haney moved to approve the following Town Wide Cleanup <u>Resolution</u> and to authorize the First Selectman to sign:

Resolution for Town Wide Cleanup Month

WHEREAS, the Oxford Conservation Commission Inland Wetlands Agency has declared from April 1st through April 30th as Town Wide Cleanup Month, and;

WHEREAS, Town Wide Cleanup Month is celebrated annually to recommit to protect our flora and fauna and make Oxford a beautiful place to live, and;

WHEREAS, the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Oxford reaffirms its commitment to the goals and principles of Town Wide Cleanup Month in keeping with our goal to protect and make Oxford a beautiful place to live, and supports Town Wide Cleanup by:

- 1. Inviting and encouraging all citizens, businesses, organizations, schools, clubs, neighborhoods and families to participate in community Town Wide Cleanup activities, and
- 2. By providing support through participation of Town Departments.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Oxford declare from April 1st through April 30th as **Town Wide Cleanup Month** and authorizes the Public Works Department to remain open until 5:00 PM on the last two (2) Saturday's of April.

This was seconded by Kathy Johnson. All 3 Ayes. Motion carries.

Discussion: This is what the town has done every year, and it allows the Boy Scouts, and the Football Team and other sport activities, along with the Conservation Core at the High School to pick up stuff on our streets and it does make a difference. It makes Oxford a more beautiful town. First Selectman George Temple supports this.

6. Approve Use of Town Hall Parking Lot for Yale-New Haven Hospital Mobile Mammography Van

MOTION:

Jeff Haney moved to approve the use of the Town Hall parking lot for the Yale-New Haven Mobile Mammogram Van for Wednesday, April 6, 2016. This was seconded by Kathy Johnson. All 3 Ayes. Motion carries.

Discussion: We did this last year in support of Breast Cancer Awareness, and we did have one individual who had to get checked out after the screening. We had people from Town Hall who have never had a mammogram get one. This is a very important function. Denise Randall organized this, and the Yale New Haven Mobile Mammogram Van just needs a location to park the van.

7. Tax Refunds

MOTION:

Jeff Haney moved to approve the tax refunds, totaling \$24,480.83, as presented and requested by the Tax Collector in her letter received on 2/29/16 and request two signatures. This was seconded by Kathy Johnson. All 3 Ayes. Motion carries.

Discussion: These are tax refunds for people who have gotten rid of vehicles, or people who have paid real estate taxes that were also paid out of the bank's escrow account. These are also for adjustments made by the Assessor on real estate taxes.

8. Purchase Property on Bowers Hill Road – Approve and Forward to Town Meeting

MOTION:

Jeff Haney moved to approve the purchase of 3.3 acres located at 133 Bowers Hill Road, for the amount of \$45,000.00, and to forward this matter to a Town Meeting. This was seconded by First Selectman George Temple. All 3 Ayes. Motion carries.

Discussion: Jim Hliva stated that there are fees from Inland/Wetlands that go into a conservation fund, and the money to purchase the parcel will come out of this fund. Inland/Wetlands will be voting on this Tuesday night and have to approve the money coming out of the fund prior to the Town Meeting. This will then be sent to a Town Meeting to approve the funds. First Selectman Temple stated he has walked this property and the town has been assessing it for \$92,000. Kathy Johnson asked if we let this property go, can someone else buy it and build something there. First Selectman Temple stated yes, but the only way it can be purchased is if one of the two neighbors bought it. Kathy Johnson was not excited about spending money on this, but after hearing these comments, now supports it. First Selectman Temple stated it will be nice to put in picnic

tables and fireplaces there. It will be leading into where the hiking trails are going in. It is land-locked property. Kathy Johnson asked about the Aggie Park project and expressed concerns over the builder. First Selectman George Temple stated that he is meeting with the chairman of the committee tomorrow. The committee went with the lowest acceptable bidder. First Selectman Temple would rather go with an Oxford company. When the High School field was done, they did an excellent job. He will see if we can negotiate with them to get their figure down. This item is still pending, and will be voted on at the next meeting.

9. LOTCIP Application for Reconstruction of Hawley Road to Willenbrock Road – Approve and Authorize First Selectman to Sign

MOTION:

Jeff Haney moved to approve the Connecticut Department of Transportation's LOTCIP Application for the reconstruction of Hawley Road to Willenbrock Road and to authorize the First Selectman to sign the contract; as presented and requested by the Acting Grant Writer Administrator in her letter dated 2/24/16. This was seconded by Kathy Johnson. All 3 Ayes. Motion carries.

Discussion: This is for a grant to repave Willenbrock Road. It really needs to be done. This is in the industrial area and we have tenants there.

10. Oxford Ambulance Associations 2015 Volunteer Tax Abatements - Approve

MOTION:

Jeff Haney moved to approve the attached 2015 Oxford Ambulance Association's Volunteer Tax Abatements as presented by the Director in his letter received 2/29/16. This was seconded by Kathy Johnson. All 3 Ayes. Motion carries.

Discussion: First Selectman George Temple stated we appreciate their service and it is a small way to say thank you.

11. Report of First Selectman

Today is National Read Across America Day, and First Selectman George Temple went to the Pre-K lass at KinderCare and read to the 35 kids there and had a great time.

Thanks to the Public Works Department for moving the desk he had in Shelton to Oxford. This is donated to the Town of Oxford, and he appreciates their efforts.

AUDIENCE OF CITIZENS

Steven Brown, 8 Bonnie Lane, Oxford, would like to make a correction regarding his comments at a prior meeting that an email that went out regarding Aggie Park and the correction is that it was not illegal. He suggested that the Board of Selectmen look at the email that went out. Mr. Brown stated that they should not do it publically, and it went out to select people in town specifically parents of soccer players. It was encouraging people to vote yes. In his opinion, it was unethical to send out this letter. He did not receive the letter. He does not expect town employees to act as advocates for one particular project or another. If it is private, it would be okay but he expects something different from people that work for the town. First Selectman Temple stated Parks & Recreation are very supportive of their group. First Selectman Temple does not think it made any difference with the vote, and he did not see any email that went out. He does not make phone calls or send emails like that. The Library Committee is the same way, Friends of The Library also try to get people out to vote. Mr. Brown stated that the email said vote yes and here is why you should vote yes, and because Center School will go between the two schools, and the fields might be disrupted. This is not even close, and it is an opinion. When you are a town employee, paid by the taxes in the town, and if acting in their public role, this should not be done. First Selectman Temple stated that it should not happen.
