Tuesday, January 28, 2013

The **Regular Meeting** of the Oxford Conservation Commission/Inland Wetlands Agency was held in the Main Meeting Room of the S.B. Church Memorial Town Hall on Tuesday, January 28th, 2013.

Meeting was called to order at 7:34 P.M. by Chairman Michael Herde

NEW BUSINESS:

1) (IW 13-137) Anastasious Badas (35 Oxford Rd./Heavenly Donuts)

Mr. Badas was present to answer questions from the Commission regarding his project for a donut shop (Heavenly Donuts) located at 35 Oxford Road. The revised map was shown to the Commission members as well as review information from the Town Engineer. The Commission reviewed the information.

I.W.E. Officer A. Ferrillo stated: The applicant's engineer also added the Litter Control Standards and includes the smart sponge in the catch basins and the Town Engineer has reviewed the final plan and has no issues.

Chairman M. Herde asked: Will there be sumps in the catch basins as well?

I.W.E. Officer A. Ferrillo stated: That is correct.

Chairman M. Herde asked: Does our Litter Control Standard include cleaning out of the catch basins?

I.W.E. Officer A. Ferrillo stated: I don't believe it does.

Commissioner T. Adamski agreed that it is not included.

Chairman M. Herde asked: Is water detention all on site?

I.W.E. Officer A. Ferrillo replied: Yes, it is all underground.

Chairman M. Herde stated: Ok, so there is an oil separator.

I.W.E. Officer A. Ferrillo stated: Yes.

Commissioner T. Adamski stated: So the closest wetland is across the street.

I.W.E. Officer A. Ferrillo asked: There is city water and sewer there correct?

Mr. Badas replied: Yes.

I.W.E. Officer A. Ferrillo asked: You also have natural gas correct?

Mr. Badas replied: Yes.

Chairman M. Herde asked if our engineer has had their full review on this?

I.W.E. Officer A. Ferrillo stated: Yes.

I.W.E. Officer A. Ferrillo stated to Mr. Badas: For commercial sites in town, the Commission would like to see a log kept as to when any cleanups are performed on site by your employees.

Mr. Badas stated: That would be no problem. I don't like to see a mess out in the parking lot.

Commissioner B. Richter asked how many parking spaces there are.

Mr. Badas replied: 32 spaces. Originally it was set up for 22 spaces but a restaurant does require 32 spaces so we expanded it and made some other changes and the town engineer wanted another catch basin and pipe placed to catch some of the water that comes down off the hill. These changes are on the plan.

Chairman M. Herde asked: Does anyone have any other comments?

Commissioner T. Adamski asked if Nafis & Young (Town Engineer) are happy?

I.W.E. Officer A. Ferrillo replied: Yes. The response letters are in your folder.

Chairman M. Herde asked if the Commission had any other comments.

MOTION made by Commissioner T. Adamski to approve application (IW 13-137)

Anastasious Badas- 35 Oxford Road (Heavenly Donuts) no direct impact to wetland and all possible measures to collect pollutants on site Seconded by Commissioner B. Richter.

All in favor 5-0.

Chairman M. Herde asked about the grease trap and the removal system.

Mr. Badas stated that he has people come in and pump it out.

Chairman M. Herde asked: Is there any storage outside?

Mr. Badas replied: There will be a tank outside.

I.W.E. Officer A. Ferrillo stated: We will have to keep an eye on that because if it breaks it can get into the sewer system.

Mr. Badas added: Yes. It's going to be an outside grease trap.

Chairman M. Herde asked about the storage outside.

Mr. Badas replied: Well, it holds so many gallons and separates it and every so often you have to have it pumped out.

Chairman M. Herde stated: You're thinking of your septic or sewer line, I'm talking about the cooking only.

Mr. Badas replied: The cooking is a separate line which is underground.

Mr. Badas stated: It's not actually a grease substance. What I have at the Derby store is different. I won't have a barrel because I'm going to have an external grease trap that goes into the ground.

Chairman M. Herde asked: So this one is underground?

Mr. Badas replied: Yes.

Chairman M. Herde pointed out the sewer line grease trap on the map.

Chairman M. Herde asked: So that line goes right from interior with sort of funnel in the kitchen that goes right from the fryolator?

Commissioner T. Adamski stated: Ok. So it actually never gets dumped.

Mr. Badas replied: right.

Chairman M. Herde asked: So you have no grease storage outside then?

Mr. Badas replied: No. We have an external grease trap that is in the ground. In Derby, I have a barrel that we empty every day.

Chairman M. Herde stated: That's what I'm getting at, I don't want anything in the dumpster and I don't want an exposed grease trap on the top. So if you can just bare that in mind that is what we are looking at right now and if it appears later, it's a new application.

Mr. Badas replied: Ok.

Chairman M. Herde stated: Ok. That is usually the biggest thing with restaurants is that grease gets put into the dumpster then it leaks out the bottom and all over the parking lot and you hope it gets caught in the catch basin.

Mr. Badas stated: We have one fryolator and there is not any grease that comes out of there, its filtered.

Chairman M. Herde stated: Something has to come out of that filter, that is what I'm saying, where does that filter go.

Mr. Badas stated: It's not actually a grease substance, its powder. What I have at the Derby store is different. I won't have a barrel because I'm going to have an external grease trap that goes into the ground.

Commissioner T. Adamski asked: Ok, so you won't have the barrel?

Mr. Badas replied: I won't have a barrel out there, no.

Chairman M. Herde stated: Ok. That is fine then. We are all set.

Mr. Badas thanked the Commission and exited the meeting at 7:55 pm.
