# 6. Municipal Agents Report:

Spring has sprung, finally, after a long dreary winter! Daffodils and crocuses brightened up our early days of Spring and our lilies poked through our last snow. I remember looking out my window and seeing them covered with snow hoping they would survive. they did! Now the buds on our trees are starting to burst open. I love it when our spring flowering trees bloom. To me, that is the final stage to wonderfully warm, Spring days. We are well on our way to some glorious days.

Big changes are coming to you 401k especially if you haven't started drawing on it and are still working. they claim that the United States if on the brink of a retirement crisis. Your 401k is supposed to be your primary savings tool for Seniors. According to the census bureau, by the end of this decade 21% of the country's population will be 65 or older. Most non-retired adults have some sort of retirement but perhaps not adequate. Now Congress is looking to help Americans save by bolstering 401k's. A new bill which is expected to reach President Biden's desk by the end of the year could require most employer-sponsored retirement plans to enroll their workers automatically making it easier for older workers and others to make catch-up contributions. Americans had pension plans, Social Security benefits, and IRA's. This is not the case anymore. Now, pension plans are nearly extinct. Social Security payments still provide about 90% of income for a quarter of older adults. Currently, the Social Security trust fund is facing a 75-year deficit and without intervention it will be depleted by the mid 2030's. Lawmakers have reached a stalemate on how to fix it.

When the 401k was introduced in 1978, it was not designed to be the primary source of income. At the time, most higher wage earners used the plan more that the low wage earners who couldn't afford to contribute. Less than 40% of lower paid workers have IRA accounts compared to 80% of middle- and upper-income families. In mid-April, Congress and the Senate passed a bill to change IRA's. Changes include automatic enrollment at a 3% of salary enrollment and would automatically increase by 1% each year until it reaches 10%. (You can opt out). For seniors, there could also be a catch-up phase in the new bill for those who would like to add more to their IRA's. Another change would be to change the mandatory age from 72 to 75 to take your distributions, keep an eye out for new changes coming through for our IRA's. Wishing everyone a Happy Memorial Day.
