How We Prioritize Our Work

Priority 1

- Structure is a Single Family Dwelling, Owner Occupied
- Damage Level is assessed as "Total Loss", "Major" or "Minor"
- No or insufficient Insurance coverage
- Occupants have age, mobility or medical issues, especially breathing and work is beyond owner's capability to do.
- Tree damage causes hazardous access to the home or has cut off utilities to the home or rebuild process. Home damaged by trees. Large amount of trees or brush involved.

Priority 2

- Structure is a Single Family Dwelling, Owner occupied
- Damage level is "Major" or "Minor"
- No or insufficient Insurance coverage
- Occupants have no health or mobility Issues
- Trees and brush down near home, but do not impede access. Medium amounts of trees involved.

Priority 3

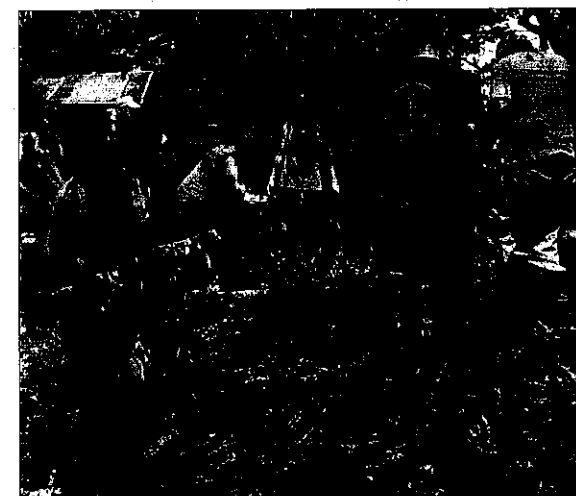
- Structure is a Single Family Dwelling, Owner occupied
- Damage Level is assessed as "Minor"
- No or insufficient Insurance coverage
- Occupants have no health or mobility Issues
- Some trees or brush to clean up.
