Oxford Animal Shelter – Annual Report

- The Oxford Animal Shelter staff is responsible for handling animals of all types from pets to wildlife. We are responsible to investigate mistreated animals and control those that are abandoned, lost or pose a threat to the residents in town.
- Animal control involves a combination of animal investigation, care and education. Animal control officers can patrol public areas, respond to service calls and work in shelters. While working in the shelter, we are charged with caring for all animals in our custody, providing food, clean living environment, fresh clean water and may arrange for veterinary care when needed.
- Animal Control works to educate the public on pet laws and licensing, animal control operations and general animal control care.
- Currently, we are in the final stages of completing a new animal shelter building which will be fully operational in the coming months.
- Placed / returned over 70 animals in the 2014 – 2015 fiscal year
- Respond to routine and emergency calls

Please find attached a summary of fiscal year activity for 2014/2015. The building activity for the above-referenced fiscal year totals 747 permits of which 255 were building permits, 191 were electrical permits, 131 heating permits, 104 plumbing permits and 65 C.O.'s issued.

During this fiscal year, the building department was staffed by one-full-time building official and one Administrative secretary. The budget for this fiscal year was \$129,287.00. The building department generated \$142,366.00 in revenue.

Oxford Conservation Commission / Inland Wetlands Agency

Re: Annual Report for the Fiscal Year of July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2015

The Oxford Conservation Commission Inland Wetlands Agency is a five member appointed board responsible for administering the Inland Wetlands Statutes of the State of Connecticut and the Inland Wetlands and Watercourses Regulations of the Town of Oxford. The Commission meets on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of the month to review and act on applications submitted to the staff of the Inland Wetlands Agency. All Commission members and staff are required to attend Department of Energy & Environmental Protection training sessions and seminars to keep abreast of changes in the wetlands statutes and recent court decisions that affect the duties and responsibilities of wetland agencies. Staff and Commission members also attend numerous educational classes that pertain to agricultural uses of wetlands and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Wetland regulations on the federal level. The Commission and Agency rely on the Secretary, Denise Randall to organize and maintain all proper paperwork necessary for the files and more effectively serve the public through out the work week. The Inland Wetlands Enforcement Officer, Andrew Ferrillo Jr. administers routine applications not requiring activity in the wetlands and conducts all inspections to ensure compliance with permit conditions. The Commission and Agency also employ the services of Nafis & Young Engineers, Southwest Conservation District, and will periodically contract with specialists to review all the technical aspects of complex applications as it relates to environmental impacts.

Listed below you will find the activities for the Fiscal Year July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2015

The Commission had 22 regular meetings, 3 special meetings,, and several independent site walks by Commission Members and the Enforcement Officer. The Commission is currently in litigation on a violation on Park Road regarding Flood Plain and wetlands filling.

The Agency, through the Inland Wetlands Commission processed 27 applications with impact in wetlands and regulated areas. The Wetlands Officer processed 167 applications, which were for various building and other land use permits, Certificate of Occupancies and activities not requiring Commission action. The Inland Wetlands Enforcement Officer worked 1,408 hours, conducted 566 inspections, and investigated 14 complaints/violations.

The Inland Wetlands Agency collected \$ 69,968.50 in town and state fees. All town fees are deposited in the Town of Oxford Conservation Fund, to be used for the purchase of Open Space. The Inland Wetlands Agency's annual budget for the Fiscal Year July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2015 was \$ 120,047.00

The Oxford Conservation Commission is continuing to update the map showing all Open Space and designated conservation easements within the Town of Oxford.

The Commission and staff annually conduct a review of the all detention basins and ponds, that are required to be maintained by the Town of Oxford so as to determine which are in need of maintenance This will improve the quality of urban runoff from roads, parking lots, residential neighborhoods, commercial areas and industrial sites and to reduce peak storm water runoff rates by providing temporary storage during larger storm events.

The Conservation Commission through the efforts of Commission Member Tom Adamski and the Youth Conservation Corps in Oxford High School having been working to add additional trails to Rock House Hill and improve the existing ones.

As the Town of Oxford moves into the future, the Conservation Commission Inland Wetlands Agency anticipates further growth on marginal properties containing more wetlands and regulated areas, therefore the work load and the potential for litigation will increase as the Connecticut Inland Wetlands Statutes and Local Wetland Regulations come into conflict with landowners and developers.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ANNUAL PROGRESS REPORT

Economic Development Commission Annual Town Report.

August 6, 2015

Summary:

Economic Development efforts have moved steadily forward this past year despite a poor National growth factor and a State growth factor that is poor at best. Please note the enclosed up to date growth information that outlines the economic direction that Oxford is headed.

Rental vacancies are non existent in the industrial zone other than for those who wish to build the own building. The commercial zone with the birth of " Quarry Walk" shopping center on Route 67. is just beginning to see growth all along Route 67 and will increase over the coming years.

The ADZ. [Airport Development Zone] , the two mile industrial zone that surrounds Oxford Airport is turning out to be the economic engine that we knew it would be. In the enclosed Oxford information you we see that the Zone has added 8 companies that have applied for tax abatements and have been accepted. A number of these companies are currently under construction and if rentals, they have already moved into the Zone. Inquires are made daily from all over the world on the ADZ.

A consistent low Mil rate that currently is 24.97 [third lowest rate in New Haven County.] has been a real incentive for companies and developers to consider Oxford for future development. Predictable and efficient regulatory processes add to the reasons that Oxford will be in the near future the hub of economic development in Western Connecticut.

I ask that you review the enclosed information on Oxford's growth and tax structure over the next 20 years. These are exciting times in the economic growth of Oxford

As Economic Development Director, I continue to pursue all development opportunities in the ADZ. as well as growth opportunities throughout the Town of Oxford

The CPV. [Competitive Power Ventures] power plant is in the final stages of preparing to be built in Woodruff Hills. This project is a billion dollar development that will take 3 years to complete. employ 500 tradesmen and supply gas turbine driven electricity to some 750,000 home in Connecticut and New England. Please see enclosed information on the power plant. Note that the plant will generate \$112,000,000 in tax revenues to Oxford over the next 23 years. They will average over \$5,000,000 a year thru 2038.

Masonic Care with a 131 acre project in the permitting stage that will accommodate some 350 clients in their new assisted living facility to be located at the upper end of Riggs Street. Please note the "Pilot" program we put together to add close to \$ 1,000,000 a year to Oxford when the project is completed. Please see the enclosed Oxford projected growth paragraphs for additional information.

In the commercial zone along Route 67, "Quarry Walk" as Town Center is currently underway . The leveling of the quarry is almost completed Market 32 and Newtown Savings Bank are about to begin construction on the site with Griffin Hospital Health Care facility soon to follow. With over 70 stores and restaurants and condo's this project will truly be the Town Center.

Economic Growth Equals Grand List Growth.

In fiscal year 2014/15 economic growth added \$ 635,240 to the industrial / commercial Grand List Taxable Properties. Which now stands at over 93 million dollars or a less than 8% of the Town's tax revenues.

With a Mil rate of 24.97. Oxford is somewhere between 2 to 6 mils less than other Connecticut towns and cities of its size with an industrial and commercial base and with the projected additional taxes thru 2038 as listed in the enclosed growth information. Oxford can maintain a low mil rate for many years to come. Thus lower taxes for all.

A home owner will see his or her Town Taxes on there home with a 1 to 2 pt. mil rate drop go down by as much as \$ 500 to a \$1000 a year and remain lower over the years. Industrial/Commercial Oxford companies will also see lower taxes over the coming years. Thus adding dollars to there bottom lines.

The Oxford Economic Development Commission is please at this time with our accomplishments this past year. It is the culmination of much hard work over this past 3 ½ years. We are never satisfied with what has been accomplished but rather look forward to what more we can do to make " Oxford a great place to work and live."

Current information was supplied by Oxford's Assessor Eva Lintzner and her Associates.

Estimates beyond 2015/16 are the same as 2015/16 except where a designated amount has been agreed to. Example the power plant approximate tax thru 2038. Increase business development as well as normal tax assessments increases should add an additional 20 to 33% to the tax base over the coming years.

Why Oxford Connecticut?

Oxford is and has been the fastest growing Town of it's size in the State over the last four years.. Oxford has a population of just over 13,000 resident with an annual household income of \$120,500. per annum. Oxford is located in western central Connecticut.

Oxford has a infrastructure that supports a network of highways that include :

- + US. Route 84 on the northern end of Town
- + State Hgwy. 67 dissects the Town and runs from Route 84 on the north to State Route 8 on the south.
- + Routes 42 and 188 both offer access to neighboring communities and to Routes 84 and 8.

Oxford is located:

- + Approximately one hour and forty five minutes from New York.
- + Two hours from the Boston area.
- + Less than an hour from Stamford.
- + Forty five minutes from New Haven, Bridgeport, and Hartford.
- + Thirty minutes from Danbury.

Yale University is located some 35 minutes from Oxford in New Haven Connecticut with another 27 colleges and locations of higher learning within 45 minutes of Oxford.

There are 53 hospitals and health care facilities within 30 miles of the Town. There are some 250,000 people that live and work within 20 miles of Oxford. Thus offering access to a strong labor market.

Oxford Airport is the home to a number of corporate jet fleets that are located in Connecticut as well as Westchester County NY. The number continues to grow each month so that an additional hanger is being built. Teterboro and Westchester County Airports are very heavily trafficked.

Oxford has become the alternative. with unlimited potential..

Information on the Town of Oxford.

- + On August 12 th. of 2013 Governor Malloy declared the 2500 acres that surround the Airport to be an Enterprise Zone , to be known as the ADZ. [Airport Development Zone]
- + The ADZ. incorporates 2500 acres of industrial land located within a 2 mile radius of the airport. It currently has 60% availability for development with many projects currently underway.
- + The Zone features all the utilities necessary to conform to anyone building in the Zone. From three phase electric, to natural gas , to water, to sewers and the internet.
- + The Zone offers as stated in Governor Malloy's Declaration an 80 % Town Tax abatement for 5 years as well as a 25 to 50 % State Business tax abatement for 10 years.
- + These Tax abatements are based on a company adding substantially to an existing facility currently doing business in the Zone, Bring or starting a business to be located in the Zone or renting a location in the Zone that has been unoccupied for at least a year.
- + Those who apply must be approved by the CAA.[Connecticut Airport Authority].
- = In the 16 months since the ADZ was formed we have had 7 Companies apply and be accepted.
- + Currently underway is the Corporate Headquarters of XAL on Christian St. & Hawley Rd. A 100,000 s/f national headquarters for this former NYC. Company
- + Adam Scales has just broken ground on the corner of Fox Hollow Road for a 30,000 s/f US. headquarters. They are coming from Danbury.
- + Stihl Mfg. The world's largest hand tool & chain saw manufacturer are in the permit stage to build there northeast 300,000 s/f distribution center on Hawley Rd. They will be adding another 200,00 s/f within five years.
- + B.United International, the gourmet brewery in the Fox Hollow Industrial Park is in the application stage to add a 25.000 s/f additional building to his current 19,000 s/f facility..
- + Onyx France ,an Orange CT, company, are in permit stage to build a 48,000 s/f distribution center and Headquarters on North Larkey Rd.
- + The Hurley group , New Haven Ct. and owner of Hurley Park, has purchased land on Morse Road and are clearing it to construct a 75,000 s/f flex building on the sight.

+ Marc Ocykowski has cleared land in his Fox Hollow Industrial Park to put up a 30,000 s/f Flex building.

= Oxford has a number of up coming projects that will add to it's terrific growth curve.

+ The Town has very limited industrial s/f available but has eager builders who build to suit.

+ CPV. is currently going through the final necessary steps to commence the building a 805 MW.. gas turbine driven electric power plant that will supply up to 750,000 home in Connecticut and New England. It is to be located in the Woodruff Hills section of Town ,behind the Airport. This a 1 billion dollar project and will take 3 years to build. and when completed . It will be the largest tax payer in Oxford.

+ We look forward to Dr. Hollander and the River Bend Group moving forward with Technology Park in the ADZ. River Bend will build to suit and offers a turn key facility. There are over 400 acres in the Park with an other 150 acres scattered around the Zone.

+ Masonic Care are in the application stage of building a 131 acre Assisted Living facility that will house approximately 350 clients in this very upscale complex, This is over a 125 million dollar project. and will be completed in stages by 2020.

The Commercial Area – along Route 67 is being greatly enhanced by the addition of “ Quarry Walk “ Oxford's new mixed use shopping center that is currently underway and will be completed in 3 stages. Stage 1 will in compass a 55,000 s/f Market 32, a Newtown Savings Bank, a Hospital Health Care facility. plus additional businesses.

Oxford has a number of other commercial projects in permit stages and more on the way.

I believe that Oxford offers a unique economic opportunity for those looking to start a business or grow a business in an atmosphere of growth in tough economic times. Growth that is backed by a sound fiscal community and one that appreciates those who work and live here.





Annual report for FY2014-15

Fiscal year 2014-15 was a busy year for the Fire Department. It started early with two structure fires within two weeks; one in the last week of February and the other one in the first week of March. These came at a time when winter was at its worst! Fortunately there were no FF or civilian injuries. The approved budget was up but unplanned apparatus repairs exceeded our estimates. The number of calls was 411 down 11 and, the number of active fire fighters was 100 down 4. Call and training statistics used for this report will be for the calendar year 2014.

The 2014 work load for the Fire Department was about the same as last year. There were 411 calls, down 11 from last year. The number of fire fighters was 100. As usual everyone rose to the challenge and the total fire fighters attending calls during 2014 made the average number per call sixteen. There were 39 fires; 24 structure fires 6 vehicle fires, 4 brush fires and 5 miscellaneous. There were 107 rescue/medical assist, 115 false alarms, 26 mutual aid, 20 hazardous conditions and 104 other responses. To respond to these emergencies and resolve the issues, the fire fighters of the Oxford Fire Department gave the town of Oxford 8,572 hours of their time.

In 2015 Oxford fire fighters continued to learn new skills and honed the ones they have. 1,059 FFs spent 2,294 hours in classes and on the fire ground training during the year to help them deal with whatever emergencies they encounter. In addition, one new fire fighter completed NFPA Firefighter I Certification spending at least 150 hours in the program, one fire fighter went on to complete NFPA Fire Certification II for advanced skills and one fire fighter completed Fire Service Instructor I and has used his new skills to help train Oxford fire fighters. We take our job seriously!

The FY 2014-15 General Fund Budget was once again different than the previous year and as usual a continual challenge. The bottom line for the Fire Department budget was an overrun of \$22,988.39. An emergency replacement of the hot water heater at Quaker Farms fire station cost \$1,085 which was covered by transfers within our budget. Unplanned vehicle repairs were \$18,990 over budget. Included is a \$2,200 overrun for a required 7 year tire replacement for the aerial ladder truck. The Board of Finance reduced our estimate and when the bill came in they told us to take the overrun out of account 812, Vehicle Repairs. All repairs were documented when they occurred in memos to the Board of Selectmen and Board of Finance. After the final transfer of unexpended funds, \$13,896.92 is required to be transferred from outside funds to Account 812. Over runs in the electricity account of \$1,228.69 and heating oil of \$7,862.78 occurred when requested increases in these accounts were eliminated by the Board of Finance during budget planning. These will also require transfers to the Fire Department budget from outside sources.

What's New? The new specification for OFD first line Engines was completed by a committee of members from the three fire companies and approved by the Board of Fire Chiefs. The Board of Selectmen approved the specification and directed the Fire Department to send it out for bids to replace Engine 51 which is 26 years old. That will be the first of the three first line pumpers to be replaced. The new Engine 51 is now at the vendor in Connecticut for final equipment mounting and should be in service shortly. The new Marine 1 boat was moved to FY2015-16.

Replacing capital equipment in the Fire Department inventory has continued. A new PortaCount SCBA Fit Tester Model 8038A was purchased and put in service for fit testing all interior FFs. The additional radio site in Beacon Falls for the high band radio system was completed under budget and is in service. It has reduced/eliminated radio communication problems for the lower part of Oxford Road (RT 67). Both of these projects were completed under budget. The radio site was \$8,757 under and the fit tester \$2,171 under.

We continued the on going challenge of getting funds from the Federal Grant process. One of the remaining capital equipment replacements for the Fire Department is our Scott SCBA Air Paks. They need to be replaced and out of service by FY2016-17. We continue to work with the town's Grant Administrator this year and submitted a request for the funds for FY2015-16 and are waiting for notification.

2015 Annual Report by First Selectman George R. Temple

The last fiscal year has been very exciting because many industries are looking at Oxford to call home. A new town center is in progress on Route 67 and we are excited to announce that it will be opening next year so our residents won't have to drive out of town to shop for their groceries. We are also happy to announce that Stihl Northeast is building almost a 400,000 square foot distribution center in town and the CPV project received approval from the Connecticut Siting Council to build and the plant will be the leading taxpayer in town. Another company, XAL is building a 100,000 square foot national headquarters on Christian Street and Hawley Road for its innovative lighting business.

Financially the town is in great shape. We have the third lowest tax rate in New Haven County at 24.96. Our fund balance increased from \$6.1 million to \$6.3 million and is at 13.53 percent of our budget....which is well above Moody's recommended 10 percent. We also managed to reduce our debt from \$29.5 million down to \$27.8 million and this amount also includes the \$500,000 needed to repair the Quaker Farms School Roof which will be finished before the school year begins in the fall. We have maintained a bond rating of double AA-2.


Our future looks bright and is due to the hard work and diligence of our employees and our volunteers who make this community a great place to live largely, and due to their efforts, we are experiencing an increase in building fees, planning and zoning fees and town clerk fees.

We are also catching up with replacing our older vehicles. This year we bought three new large trucks for public works, a new fire engine and we just signed a contract to purchase a new ambulance to replace our 12-year-old model.

This year we are spending almost a million dollars to pave our roads and we replaced the flooring at the senior center, finished a new kitchen at Quaker Farms Fire Company and are finishing up work on our new animal shelter.

In the coming year we hope to build fields at Tetlak Park, the baseball diamond at the high school, prepare the fields so that we can have home track meets, hire new police and put up surveillance cameras at Lily Park and Ryan Courts to protect the safety of our children.

There is reason for optimism in Oxford. I believe that a tax decrease is on the horizon which will have the effect of enhancing the standard of living as well as encouraging further economic development.

During the fiscal year 2014-2015 the Municipal Agent's Office continued to provide for our seniors by fulfilling their needs concerning all State and Federal programs that were available to help supplement their income and enrich their lives through the many programs offered at our senior center.

During this past year I hosted programs concerning the S.N.A.P. Program which is the Supplemental Nutrition Program or as most know it as the Food Stamp Program. The representative from S.N.A.P. now visits the senior center monthly to help our seniors fill out applications and answer questions concerning the program.

Recently within the past few years, the seniors are targeted with new scams. As I hear of them, I try to alert our seniors to the dangers of giving out their private, personal information to strangers over the telephone or even in person. Some of these scams also lead to identity theft and I try to have at least one presenter a year on this subject.

Every year we have new seniors that are turning 65 and I am inundated with telephone calls concerning supplemental health insurance and Medicare coverage especially during the open enrollment that falls between the middle of October to the beginning of December. I try to have an insurance agent that is versed in all of Connecticut's policies that are available come in and speak with our seniors. Once again, we invited John Somero, an insurance specialist He explained all the new changes for 2014-2015. This program is always very well attended. John helps the seniors make a very important decision on what is the best insurance plan for them.


A few years ago, I started a support discussion group called "Let's Talk About It". We meet once a month in our Senior Center Library to discuss issues with others that have similar problems such as living alone, facing our fears, coping with loss, being mistreated by family members or friends or just feeling overwhelmed by daily responsibilities. The members discuss whatever is on their minds whether they are looking for advice or just to share their thoughts with the group.

I continue to write a column titled, "Municipal Agent News" in our monthly senior bulletin that reaches approximately 900 members. As the Town of Oxford's Municipal Agent, I try to write on current topics that keep our seniors updated concerning new legislation that has passed in both our Municipal and Federal Governments regarding

seniors and help them apply for benefits when needed. I also continue to use the bulletin board outside my office to post the current "Municipal Agent News," the latest scams and other important information. Along with the telephone, using these two sources is my way of reaching the senior population in our community.

As a Certified Choices Counselor, I also attend yearly training at the Agency on Aging. This helps me to keep our seniors informed on the latest "senior news".

During the fiscal year 2014-2015, we performed the town's canvass procedure with the NCOA Canvass by Mail System. In the effort to keep our voter list updated, we sent out approximately 1,200 canvass notices to all residents who have not voted in the last four years or more.

The Town held one Budget Referendum, one Republican Primary and a November Gubernatorial Election. EDR (same day registration and voting) was held simultaneously with the November Election, in the Registrar's Office.

In all, we registered 377 new voters. We also made 488 Changes and 454 Removals to the Official Voter List, in the 2014-2015 Fiscal Year.

STAFF & COMMISSION MEMBERS

The duties and responsibilities of the Planning & Zoning Commission and staff are governed by Chapter 124 and Chapter 126 of the Connecticut General Statutes.

The Planning & Zoning Department employs two full time staff members and one temporary part time clerk. The Zoning Enforcement Officer works 37.5 hours per week, the Administrative Secretary works 32 hours per week. The ZEO and Administrative Secretary are union positions. The part time temporary clerk works 19 hours per week and is a non-union position. The Commission also relies on contracted services from the Town Engineer and the Town Planner who are paid from line items in the budget.

The office is open from 9-5 Monday thru Friday and also has evening hours on Monday from 3-7 pm. The Commission is comprised of (10) members, three of which are alternates. Once elected to the Planning & Zoning Commission, the term served is four years.

The commission relies on the Administrative Secretary to run the office on a daily basis. The Administrative Secretary is responsible for answering phone calls, receiving and sending out correspondence, invoicing, maintenance of files and preparing for all public meetings held by the Planning & Zoning Commission. She also attends Planning & Zoning Meetings and takes the minutes then files them accordingly with the Town Clerk. She works with many applicants and outside agencies as well as town hall staff and commission members. The commission also relies on the Zoning Enforcement Officer to enforce, investigate, and determine all compliance or violations of the Oxford Zoning Regulations. He also writes letters of compliance, violation, places Cease & Desist orders, issues citations, determines bond amounts for certain applications, and works closely with the Town Engineer, Town Planner, Town Attorney as well as other Town Departments. The ZEO assists the public in the permit procedure for the land use agencies; he helps them fill out applications and explains all procedures. The ZEO goes out in the field to inspect various applications, violations and complaints. He does a monthly report which he presents at the Planning & Zoning Commission meetings. He is also responsible for determining fees and receiving monies on behalf of the Town, these monies are then turned over to the Finance Director. New to the Planning and Zoning Department is the temporary part-time clerk with the main purpose to provide phone coverage, administrative duties, and available as a back-up as needed. The extra coverage is to free up time for the Administrative Assistant to focus on priority tasks such as preparation for Public hearing, meetings, Agenda's and filing of minutes within the required timeframe; and for the ZEO to concentrate on the complicated applications and enforcing the regulations. The Part Time Clerk has been responsible for submitting to the Chairman, monthly financial reports associated with the fees collected and a reconciliation against major applications. Chairman Reports are then given to the Board of Finance.

MEETINGS

The Planning & Zoning Commission meets the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of each month. Most meetings run between one to two hours long depending on the applications on the agenda. This year the commission has had (23) Regular Meetings, (6) Special Meetings and (20) Public Hearings. The Public Hearings were on zone change applications, zoning text amendment applications, and new industrial applications and an affordable housing application.

REVENUE

The Planning & Zoning Department has collected approximately \$110,310 in fees this year. These fees are given to the Finance Director and all monies are deposited into the General Fund. We had three (3) major applications which included: Oxford Towne Center, Site Plan Approval Phaze 1 in the Commercial District, XLA and Stihl in the Industrial District.

EDUCATION

Changing laws and statutes that govern Planning & Zoning in Connecticut, make it necessary for staff and Commission Members to attend classes and seminars that are offered throughout the year.

CONCLUSION

The Planning & Zoning Commission must base their decisions on how applications will affect the health, safety and welfare of the residents that live in Oxford. It is their desire to maintain Oxford's rural character while encouraging development in the industrial and commercial zones. The Commission is working hard to protect the town in everyway possible while abiding by Connecticut General Statutes.

The Town Clerk's actual operating budget for Fiscal Year 2014-2015 was \$177,493.00. Total fees collected were \$399,562.20 of which \$257,818.20 was turned over to the town's general fund as well as \$10,260.00 for the town Local Capital Improvement and Historical Preservation funds. The remainder of fees was collected for various State of Connecticut agencies. Recorded on the land records this year was 2,352 documents 29 maps and 46 trade names.

This year the town website was changed to another web company, and because of this change it has increased the work load for the Town Clerk's Office. We now upload all meeting minutes and agendas for all commissions. This is done to keep the town website as safe and secure as possible.

The Town Clerk's Office received a \$5000.00 grant for Organization and Indexing. This project allowed us to capture and catalog over 45,000 images. These images were linked up with exciting index records and made available for searching and copying through the Resolution 3 land records system.


Vitals processed this year were as follows: 99 birth records, 123 marriage licenses, 79 deaths certificates. We licensed 904 dogs and 10 kennels and sold over 675 sport licenses and permits as well as issuing 67 daily permits to hunt.

There were 2 budget referendums for the Municipal and Education budgets FY-2014-2015. The Road budget passed on the first vote, May 13, 2014. (yes 1226 No 690) The Municipal (yes 805 no 557) and education budgets (yes 733 No 631) passed on the second vote, June 3, 2014.

August 12, 2014 we held a Republican Primary for Governor. November 4, 2014 was the State Election. There were a total 8,598 voters on the actual voter list with 4,720 casting their vote. The Town Clerk's office issued 153 absentee ballots.

The mission of the Oxford Cultural Arts Commission (OCAC) is to "encourage within the Town of Oxford, participation in, and promotion, development, acceptance and appreciation of, artistic and cultural activities which include, but are not limited to, music, theater, dance, painting, sculpture, architecture, literature, films, and allied arts and crafts, and to this end may join with private patrons and with institutions and professional organizations."

It is the mission of this organization to enhance the quality of life of its citizens and surrounding communities through the support of the arts. The OCAC will support, enhance, and facilitate artistic endeavors to include the performing arts (music, dance and theatrical), visual arts, literary arts and cinematography. Funding to this end will be in the form of Town monies, gifts, contributions and bequests from

businesses and individuals, and grant acquisitions from foundations, corporations and other organizations.

2014/2015

The 2015 OCAC Gallery of Art Showcase was the 6th exhibit and the 5th juried exhibit of our five year plan to utilize the showcase as the starting point focus r jump-off into a full weekend arts festival. We began using a festival statement for 2014 to define our program.

FACE FESTIVAL

2015 was our first official year taking the Gallery of Art Showcase into a full-fledged festival, entitled FACE, Festival of Arts and Cultural Entertainment. The FACE Festival was a huge success. The Oxford Cultural Arts Commission received a very generous grant from the Katherine Matthies Foundation for \$10,000.00. The money was extremely helpful in attaining our five year goal of moving the showcase into festival status. This generous grant from the Katherine Matthies Foundation enabled us to present numerous musical acts, a poetry salon, a theater program, art instruction and a public art display which encompassed the entire town. The community came together to present this wonderful event, including local area businesses who generously gave of their resources and time to contribute to Oxford's FACE festival. Local crafters were on hand to present and sell their wares, adding a beneficial economic component to our community.

In 2015, the Oxford Cultural Arts Commission also solidified a community partnering with our local grange, Oxford Grange #194. This has proven to be an extremely beneficial partnering for our community in fostering an outlet for our citizens to participate in artistic endeavors. Each second Monday of the month, the OCAC, in partnership with the Grange, presents an open mic night, featuring local artists and poets, as well as featured musical acts. The generosity of the Grange in the use of its hall and stage to the OCAC speaks volumes to the Grange's intention and mission of providing anything it can for Oxford citizens and its surrounding communities.

This partnering has been tremendously beneficial to the mission of the OCAC, as well as to its citizens in the Town of Oxford.

The Oxford Cultural Arts Commission yearly is awarded an extremely modest budget which makes it difficult to present cultural events and activities for our community, but it is with the help of very dedicated volunteers that we shall continue to strive to keep the arts alive in Oxford.

ADULT EDUCATION

The Oxford Public School System is an active participant in the Adult Education Program of the Naugatuck School District. Oxford's contractual agreement with Naugatuck allows for participation in all Adult Education courses held at Naugatuck High School.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The Oxford Public School System provides all certified staff with appropriate professional development opportunities, at no cost to the employee, as required by law. Programs are aimed at improving student achievement, maintaining safe school environments and other relevant topics.

ENROLLMENT

The pre-kindergarten through grade 12 students received their education at Oxford's four schools. Students interested in the study of vocational agriculture attended Nonnewaug High School on a tuition basis. Some Oxford students also attended Emmett O'Brien and the Sound School. GRANTS

Oxford automatically receives funds from the State for regular education under the provisions of the Education Cost Sharing (ECS) Act as well as of money for special education and special education transportation costs. In addition, each year the District, through the actions of its administrative staff and faculty, is awarded grant money from both the state and federal governments. These monies greatly contribute towards paying for the costs of education; and thereby, ease the burden of local taxpayers. During the 2014-2015 school year, the District obtained a total **\$531,863** in grant funds. These funds were used to defray the costs of specific regular education and special education programs.


CONCLUSION



Oxford Public Library Annual Report

July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015

Circulation and Interlibrary Loan:

Oxford Public Library is a vital part of the Bibliomation consortium, which gives our patrons easy access to the collections of 62 public libraries. The library uses an open-source system called Evergreen to circulate materials and catalog. Oxford circulated 37,509 books, videos, DVDs, audiobooks, magazines and other items. Oxford patrons are checking out 43% of their books from other libraries. The Bibliomation average for other CT libraries is around 22%. Patrons borrowed 4,302 materials from other libraries through our interlibrary loan system. We loaned 1,279 materials through interlibrary loan to other libraries. We were not able to fill 21 loan requests. The library was closed on Saturdays and Sundays. We were open from 8am-8pm Mondays and Thursdays, and 8am-5pm Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays year round, for 51 hours each week.

Patron Registration and Databases:

Through our web page (<http://www.oxfordlib.org>), which is updated weekly, patrons can access Oxford's library catalog, renew their books, and request books online to be reserved or shipped to us from other libraries. Patrons can also listen to digital downloadable audiobooks or read digital ebooks on their computers and mobile devices from a database called Overdrive provided by our Bibliomation consortium. The library has a Pinterest and Facebook page and is subscribed to eSequels, Novelist, and Wowbrary databases. We have over 180 titles to our circulating kindle devices. We have 4,128 adults and 1,913 child active cardholders in our database. That's a total of 6,076, which is 47.2% of the population of Oxford.

Books and Friends:

We added 2,183 new books and materials to our collection, and deleted 2,566 materials to make room. Our collection now stands at 34,305.

The Friends did fundraisers in 2014-2015 such as holding the Holiday Raffle, and increased the in-house book sale capacity. They continued their generous funding of museum passes and bought materials such as program refreshments and prizes for summer readers.

Library Board of Directors:

The Library Board of Directors met from September 2014 through June 2015.

The Library Planning and Building Committee met from September 2014 to June 2015. Chair George Mitchell spoke with First Selectman George Temple, who has pledged support for funding the Library project as a standalone

construction project at Great Oak Road. The Miriam Strong bequest funds of \$899,000 for the library's construction are in the process of reclamation from the embezzlement by the co-executor to his personal accounts, although the timing is unclear as to when that process would be complete and what funds will be available to be released to the town. The committee made the motion to recommend the Great Oak construction site to the Board of Selectman on June 17, 2015 at \$3.5 million.

Staffing:

We now have four full-time staff, three part-time staff and three substitutes. We hired a new Children's Librarian who started on April 6th, Sara Martone. Laurie Abbot joined the staff as a substitute.

Budget:

The 2014/2015 fiscal year adopted budget, which passed in May 2014 was \$256,425.

Adult and Children's Programs:

Special programs were held in July and August 2014 for our summer reading program, which had a food-based theme. Through December 2014, our regular series of storytimes took place on Tuesdays for ages 3-5, and Wednesdays for children under 3. Every Monday was craft day. Many Monday and Thursday night book discussions were held for various ages. In the fall, children had canine book buddies, Kokopelli Music school visited, Yoga Together visited, and we also celebrated Banned Books Week, Teen Read Week, Halloween, Children's Book Week, Thanksgiving and Christmas with special programs and crafts.

We had no children's librarian from January-April 2015. Our new children's librarian visited and did outreach to the schools in May and June. The 2015 summer reading kickoff event was a visit from a wonderful magician. Our theme was Superhero Summer Reading.

In 2014-2015, we have held 8 adult book discussion programs with a total attendance of 70, and 74 children's programs with a total attendance of 677. That totals 82 programs and attendance of 747 in 8 months. I had to turn away 432 requests for programs for adults and children to be held at the library due to lack of space and staff. Last year's numbers reflect better on our averages, since this year we had no children's librarian for four months and then I was out sick for almost four months. We had 387 total programs with an attendance of 6235 in 2013-2014.

OXFORD PARKS AND RECREATION

Annual Report

Fiscal Year 7/1/14-6/30/15

Below is a summary of activities that are self-sustaining through fees that are collected by this office. Most of the fees collected are paid back for expenses associated with that activity.

Summer Camps: Dates July 6th through Aug 14th (6 weeks)

Huskies Camp is for children who have completed grades K-5; **OPR** Travel Camp is for children who have completed grades 5-8. **Huskies** attend Monday through Friday from 9am-4pm and spend 4 days each week at Colonial Tavern and one day each week travelling to another location for the day (Quassy, Chuck E Cheese, Rock Cats, etc). The **OPR** kids travel by bus to different locations on Monday-Wednesday each week. Some locations include SkyZone, Shelton Sports Center, Nomads Adventure Quest, McDonalds and a Movie, etc. On Thursdays, **OPR** kids spend the day at Colonial Tavern while the **Huskies** are away.

Between the 2 camps, we average approximately 120-130 children per week at an average of \$140 per week per child. The Huskies required 12 Camp Counselors and the Travel group had 7.

Other Self Sustaining Activities offered throughout the year include Boating Safety, Yoga, Aerobics, Power Fusion, Zumba, Aquasize, Pilates. Meditation, Golf Lessons, Tennis Lessons, Swimming Lessons, Mad Science, iPad Art, Computer Tots and Computer Explorers, Dance Classes, Ceramics, Princess Programs, Skyhawks Camps, Soccer Camps, Basketball Camps, Baseball Camps, Magic Workshops, Bring on the Hoopla – to name some options. All of these programs and others like them, are supported by the fees that we charge.

Oxford Parks and Recreation sponsors various sports leagues – all of which are also self-sustaining and governed by their own Boards comprised of volunteers:

Youth Basketball – approximately 450 participants ages 7 through 18

Men's Over 30 Basketball – approximately 60-75 participants

Pick Up Basketball – approximately 20 men – changes each night

Fall Co-Ed Softball – 90 participants

Women's Softball - approximately 110 participants

Men's Over 30 Softball – approximately 110 participants

Flag Football – approximately 120 children ages 5-12

Co-Ed Volleyball – approximately 150 participants

Women's Volleyball – approximately 50 participants

Oxford Youth Football and Cheer – approximately 200 participants

Oxford Otters Swim Team – approximately 100 swimmers ages 6-18 who swim year round

There are also some independent sports leagues who do not fall under the auspices of Parks and Recreation, but do service our children and use our facilities. They are:

Babe Ruth Baseball and Softball – about 400 children

Oxford Soccer League – about 450 children

Little League Softball – about 100 children

Parks and Recreation offers various **Bus Trips** throughout the year. As in most of the activities in Parks and Rec, Bus Trips are totally self supportive. During 2014-15 year, some of the offerings included Christmas in New York, Ellis Island and Statue of Liberty, Finger Lakes Winery Tour and Tasting, Yankees and Red Sox Ballgames, Whale Watch, John Adams Mansion Tour, Long Island Wine Tour and Tasting, Lancaster, PA, Newport, Radio City/Rockettes Christmas Spectacular, West Point Tour, River Rose Cruise, Tanglewood.

Some of the Regular Special Programs offered by Parks and Rec include the following:

Easter Egg Hunt – every year it's held on the Saturday before Palm Sunday. We offer prizes and eggs for about 300 young (pre-K to 2nd grade) children each year.

Fishing Rodeo – in May. We co-host this with Seymour Fish and Game Club. We give prizes for various categories and usually have attendance of about 100 people including children and their families.

Trick or Trunk – on Halloween night at Oxford High School. Generally about 1000 attend including families who decorate their car trunks and give out candy to the trick or treaters while their own children go around from car to car in a fun and safe setting. Lots of fun music, refreshments and prizes for best trunks and jack-o-lanterns.

Turkey Shoot - In mid-November – kids and their parents are allowed ten free throw basketball shots each. The total number they sink may win them a prize. Prizes are cranberry sauce, stuffing mix, a pie or a turkey. To pay for the prizes, each participant pays \$2 for their “shoot” and can go as many times as they want. Some kids win their whole Thanksgiving Dinner!

Christmas in Oxford – Town Tree lighting ceremony held on first Friday of each December. Parks and Recreation decorates the outside of the Town Hall. At the ceremony, school bands and choirs perform, the tree (as well as the other decorations) is lit, Santa arrives on a fire truck, refreshments are served in the Town Hall meeting room. Attendance is usually about 500-600 people.

Parks and Rec Dance Recital – Held in May. About 25 dancers ages 3-8 who have been taking lessons through Parks and Rec all year, perform at the Oxford Center School. There are about 300 people in the audience, all of whom enjoy refreshments after the show.

Memorial Day 5K Freedom Run/Walk – held each year on Memorial Day morning. The start/finish line of the certified course is in front of the Town Hall. This fun event draws about 400 runners and walkers – some with dogs, some with strollers. The main event gets kicked off with the Kids Rock Hopper Fun Run – 75 to 100 children run ½ mile to and from Center School, led by the Rock Hopper Penguin. Proceeds of approximately \$5,000 from this event benefit the Wounded Warrior Project, The American Day of Honor Project and our own local David S Miles American Legion.

1st Annual Oxford Food and Arts Fest – held on June 7th along Great Oak Road. We had 17 Food Trucks and about 20 crafters as well as entertainers, stilt walkers, singers, magicians, bouncy houses, dunk tank, etc. Overall there were 2,000-3,000 people who attended between noon and 6:00pm.

Facilities:

Posypanko Park, Hawkins Road. 2 Baseball Diamonds, Basketball Court, Playground, Concession Stand, Bathrooms and Storage.

Jackson Cove Park, Jackson Cove Road. Beach on Lake Zoar, Playground, Sand Volleyball Court, Boat Launch, Pavilion, Bathrooms, small Concession Stand and Guard Shack. Currently 3 separate Eagle Scout Projects in progress: construction of Canoe/Kayak storage rack and cleared pathway to the water for those vessels to put into the water; A Bocce Court near the pavilion; and Bat Houses along the perimeter of the woods.

Lily Park, Great Oak Road. Extensive Playground with Musical Components for use by children of all ages. Pergola with Picnic Tables. Park built by volunteers in memory of Lily Brooks.

Ryan's Courts, Great Oak Road. 2 Tennis Courts with lighting for night play. Courts were constructed in 2012 and paid for by Mr and Mrs David VerNooy in their son Ryan's memory, and then generously donated to The Town for the public's enjoyment.


Oxford Glen, Rt 34. Combination Soccer/Softball Field with Irrigation.

Agnes Tetlak Schiavi Park, Bowers Hill Rd. This beautiful 98 acre parcel of land has not yet been developed, but plans have been drawn, a committee appointed and \$500K Grant received from the State of CT to begin construction toward playing fields, picnic areas, parking lots, tennis and basketball courts and storage facilities. Phase 1 will include 2 Softball Fields and a Multi Purpose Field. Anticipated start date for the construction is Fall of 2015.

Oxford Parks and Recreation also schedules and maintains all of the fields at Quaker Farms, Center and Great Oak Middle Schools where the various leagues play. In addition, we schedule the gyms in those schools and the indoor pool at Oxford High School for the public's use during nights and weekends.

Each year, we sell permits to **Jackson Cove**. The permits are \$20 each and sold only to Oxford residents. Non-residents may purchase a day pass for \$25 for their car. We sold about 900 resident permits for cars, as well as another 120 permits for boats. All proceeds from the permit sales are used toward improvements at Jackson Cove, like adding more sand, lifeguard chairs and various other beach equipment. This year, a guard shack was added as well as gutters installed on pavilion/bathrooms and more cameras are being added to the front gate. We also cleared more land and added parking.

In addition to the Director, Parks and Rec employs a part time office assistant and 2 seasonal maintenance personnel, and also hired about 30 summer employees to oversee summer camp and Jackson Cove. We also retain some of the guards throughout the school year to work at the Oxford High School Pool during Open Swim nights.

1.0 History

The Town of Oxford began working on a stormwater plan during the winter of 2002/2003 to meet a projected implementation date of April 2003. The Town worked with Nafis & Young Engineers, Inc. (NYE) in developing and writing this plan. The Town completed a draft plan after receiving a final copy of the CTDEEP general permit requirements on January 9, 2004. The "State of Connecticut Department of Transportation Draft Stormwater Management Plan" was used as an outline for the Town's plan.

In 2004 the written plan was then given to the appropriate personnel within the Town of Oxford's Conservation Commission/ Inland Wetlands Agency, Planning & Zoning Commission and Public Works, the town posted a legal notice in both the Town Hall and the Public Library to inform the public that a copy of the plan was available in the Town Library for review by residents. The town did not receive any comments from the public.

In early 2005 the final draft of the plan was completed and is now available at the both the Town Hall and Public Library. In 2005 the Council of Governments of the Central Naugatuck Valley (COGNAV) arranged with TeleMedia Cable to air an EPA video on local public access television entitled "After the Rain" on two nights in December. A brochure created in conjunction with the Oxford Conservation Commission/Inland Wetlands Agency that details the importance of storm water quality and the impact on the environment was distributed at the Town Hall and the Town Library. The Town also posted a poster in the Public Works garage and Town Hall to promote public awareness best management practices of storm water management during construction.

NYE has conducted eleven (11) annual stormwater sampling events starting in the summer of 2004. Samples of six representative outfalls, two industrial, two commercial and two residential were taken on July 23, 2004, June 28, 2005, August 15, 2006, May 16, 2007, April 28, 2008, September 11, 2009, November 04, 2010, May 04, 2011, July 18, 2012, August 13, 2013 and June 19, 2014.

The Town purchased a handheld GPS/PDA system for mapping its stormwater outfalls and the required software to manage the collected data. This equipment and software was partially funded through a CTDEEP grant with the COGNAV. The Town Engineer's department is currently mapping the town outfalls and will turn over to the GPS/PDA and software to the Town's Public Works Department for future use and maintenance in the near future. A map of the town's outfalls (mapped to date) is posted in the Conservation Commission/Inland Wetlands Agency Office.

The Town's Inland Wetland Secretary initiated the storm drain-marking program with the initial labels being provided by the CTDEEP Office of Long Island Sound Programs. The town intends to move forward with volunteers assisting in labeling all the remaining catch basins. Two articles appeared in the local Waterbury Republican American Newspaper (November 16, 2006) and the Voices Newspaper (November 22, 2006)

discussing this storm drain-marking program. Approximately 20% of the Town's catch basins have been marked.

The Town is actively involved in the CTDEEP Aquifer Protection Area (APA) program. In 2009 the Town adopted its APA regulations and in 2010 updated the regulations.

In 2011, the Town re-registered the Public Works Garage and Transfer Station for the revised CTDEEP General Permit for the Discharge of Stormwater Associated with Industrial Activity. The Town has since performed the required stormwater outfall sampling in the most recent permit cycle October 1, 2011 through September 30, 2016. According to the laboratory analysis results for four consecutive biannual outfall samples all the General Permit benchmarks were achieved for all of the test parameters in 2013. The sampling is now complete until the next cycle starts on October 1, 2016.

The Town of Oxford participated in the "Household Hazardous Waste Collection Central Naugatuck Valley Planning Region" three collections April, July and October 2014. One hundred and eleven (111) Oxford households participated in these collections that disposed of 1,100 gallons of household hazardous wastes. This was an increase over the amounts disposed of in 2013.

The Town of Oxford recycled approximately 82 tons of scrap metal, 4,410 gallons of waste oil, 354 tons of commingled wastes, 180 C.Y. of Tires and 11.9 tons of electronics in 2014.

At this time, the town is awaiting any comments from the DEP concerning the Town's Draft Stormwater Management Plan. This annual report is based upon the draft plan comments by the DEP will be reflected in subsequent annual reports.

2.0 Compliance

Many of the Town's goals for the ninth year of this permit were to continue to build a foundation for further implementation of the Stormwater Management Plan. The Town's commission's such as Planning and Zoning and Inland Wetland enforcement inspections is already following many procedures. Construction plan reviews have included reviewing stormwater management and erosion controls and the town will continue these procedures while looking at ways to improve their effectiveness. A large share of the effort was directed towards the education of Town officials and employees with regards to their role within the General Permit. The Best Management Practices (BMPs) chosen by the Town are addressed below:

Section 1: Public Education and Outreach

1. Brochures / Fact Sheets

Goal: Display and Distribute Brochures

The finished brochure was distributed at a Conservation Commission /Inland Wetlands Agency meeting in early 2005. It was approved for publication and was distributed at the Town Hall and the Library. It continues to be available to the public.

2. Alternative Information Sources

Goal: Develop web site, display poster for Town, and Public Service Announcement (PSA) for local television

The web site is active and information is posted. The poster has been displayed at the Town Hall and the Public Works Garage. In December of 2005, the local cable company aired an EPA video entitled *After the Rain* on two nights.

In 2011 two USEPA brochures were included in the report's appendices "Make your home The Solution to Stormwater Pollution!, A Homeowners Guide to Healthy Habits for Clean Water" and "After the Storm, A Citizen's Guide to Understanding Stormwater". These were posted on the Town's website as included in the 2011 Annual report.

3. Library of Educational Materials

Goal: Make information available to town employees and the community

A library of educational materials is being developed and maintained at the CTDOT headquarters. As these materials are made available to the various towns in the state, materials will be procured for the various town departments as a reference for stormwater management issues.

Information on Internet websites (USEPA, CTDEEP) has also been used for reference and ideas.

4. Storm Drain / Marking Stenciling

Goal: The Town applied to CTDEEP for the drain-marking kit and received some labels for this purpose. The storm drain marking was started in 2006. Brochures were distributed to the local street residences as the labeling occurred on their respective streets.

Since 2006 approximately 20% of the catch basins were marked. This program has ceased due to lack of resources and will be reviewed in 2015 under the re-issuance of the new General Permit.

5. Watercourse Signage

Goal: Determine what watercourses and how best to expand CTDOT tributary signage program

The CTDOT already maintains signage for certain watercourses within the Town. Officials from the Town are currently looking for areas within the Town to expand this program.

Section 2: Public Involvement / Participation

1. Presentation of Draft SWMP

Goal: SWMP

The final SWMP was completed in February 2005 and was made available to certain officials within the Town. It was also made available for review by the public after the posting of a public notice in the local newspaper.

This plan was updated in early 2009. The Town assigned Commissions (Conservation/Inland Wetlands and Planning & Zoning Commission) as well as the Public Works Department have taken ownership of their respective parts of the Plans and are implementing them as required.

2. Public Information Meetings

Goal: Brochures distributed

A brochure has been created and distributed by the Conservation Commission/Inland Wetlands Agency and is available at the Town Hall and Public Library.

3. Storm Drain / Marking Stenciling

Goal: The Town implemented this program in late 2006 and is still working toward lining up volunteers and funding to continue this program. Due to a lack of resources/volunteers the process has slowed. It will be pushed again in 2015.

4. Lake and Watershed Associations / Authorities

Goal: Identify all local watershed Associations / Authorities and meet with representatives of all local groups

Associations have been contacted and discussions continue on how to best involve the resources of these groups.

Section 3: Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination

1. **Town Policy Regarding Non-Stormwater Discharges**
Goal: Implement Policy

The town's Board of Selectmen passed an Illicit Discharge and Connection Stormwater Ordinance in 2008 and assigned responsibility for enforcement to the Town's Planning & Zoning Commission.

In 2014 the Town checked catch basins and outfall mapping on seventeen (17) roads and checked twenty-six (26) outfalls for illicit discharges. No illicit discharges were observed during this round of inspections. The town will revisit this program in 2015 and perform some more inspections as required under the General Permit.

2. **Storm Sewer Map(s)**

Goal: Mapping outfalls

The Town, using its Global Positioning System (GPS), PDA and associated software mapped all outfalls 15" or greater in the "urbanized" areas of the Town in 2005.

In 2006 through 2007 outfalls 15" or greater the mapping has expanded and will be continued until all outfalls are mapped town wide.

In 2014 the outfall mapping was revised based on the illicit discharge inspections.

3. **Illicit Discharge and Elimination Program**

Goal: Continue sampling of six selected outfalls. Start sampling outfalls for ecoli to determine TMDL contribution from other outfalls.

Working with NYE, the Town selected six outfalls (two residential, two industrial, and two commercial) to be sampled and tested. These six outfalls were sampled according to the CTDEEP General Permit requirements during the 2013 season and the results are included in Appendix I.

The Town did not sample any additional outfalls for ecoli to determine TMDL in 2014 but will review again in 2015.

4. **Future Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination**

Goal: Address and enforce future non-stormwater discharges

The Town reviews each outfall during the mapping process and collects data on the condition of the stormwater discharges as observed. This information is being reviewed and the Town will investigate any suspect reports of illicit discharges.

The Town has written an Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination Manual for distribution and training purposes. The Town will continue to inspect outfalls for illicit discharges in 2015.

Section 4: Construction Site Stormwater Runoff Control

1. Requirements and Guidelines for Erosion and Sediment Controls

Goal: Implement and enforce the ordinance.

In 2008 the Town's Board of Selectmen passed a "Stormwater Management Ordinance" and assigned responsibility for enforcement to the Town's Planning & Zoning Commission, its agents and the Town Engineer.

The Town has stepped up both its initial review of any new or proposed construction projects and continues enforcement inspections of active projects to ensure erosion and sediment controls are in accordance with all local, state and federal regulations.

2. Procedures for Notifying Construction Site Developers and Operators of Requirements for Registration

Goal: Implement Town forms and makes the proper registration a condition of agency approvals for sites exceeding the 1- acre threshold

The Town continues to comply with all requirements of the General Permit for the Discharge of Stormwater and Dewatering Wastewaters Associated with Construction Activities.

3. Requirements for Construction Site Operators to Implement Appropriate Erosion and Sediment Control Best Management Practices

Goal: Continue requirements for construction site operators to implement appropriate erosion and sediment control best management practices

Planning & Zoning and Inland Wetland Agency enforcement inspections continue to ensure that all applicable regulations concerning the use of erosion and sediment control measures are followed.

Site inspection and enforcement of control measures are utilized on all of the Town's projects. Under the new ordinance there are three levels of Town enforcement. Initially the inspector issues a "Notice of Inspection" for

corrections to any deficiencies. This is followed with a "Notice of Deficiency" with set time requirements for correction of any issues. This may be used up to two times. Sites which continue to be noncompliant are issued a "Cease and Desist Order" with penalty and must stop work and bring the site into compliance before proceeding.

4. Requirements for Construction Site Operators to Control Waste at the Site

Goal: Continue requirements for construction site operators to control waste at the site

Planning & Zoning and Inland Wetland Agency enforcement inspections currently ensure that all applicable regulations concerning waste control are followed.

5. Procedures for Site Plan Review

Goal: Continue site plan review procedures

The Town Engineer reviews all site plans for conformance to the Town's, state and federal requirements relating to construction site runoff control.

6. Future Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination

Goal: Detect and address future non-stormwater discharges

The Town during the mapping process reviews each outfall and collects data on the condition of the stormwater discharges as observed. This information is being reviewed and the Town will investigate any suspect reports of illicit discharges.

7. Requirements and Guidelines for Erosion and Sediment Controls

Goal: To protect the town's surface water resources during construction activities greater than 1 acre in size.

The Town has stepped up both its initial review of any new or purposed construction projects and continues enforcement inspections of active projects to ensure erosion and sediment controls are in accordance with all local, state and federal regulations.

8. Procedures for Notifying Construction Site Developers and Operators of Requirements for Registration

Goal: Implement registration requirements for all projects exceeding the 1-acre threshold

The Town currently complies with all requirements of the General Permit for the Discharge of Stormwater and Dewatering Wastewaters Associated with Construction Activities.

9. Requirements for Construction Site Operators to Implement Appropriate Erosion and Sediment Control Best Management Practices

Goal: Continue requirements for construction site operators to implement appropriate erosion and sediment control best management practices

Planning & Zoning and Inland Wetland Agency enforcement inspections currently ensure that all applicable regulations concerning the use of erosion and sediment control measures are followed.

10. Requirements for Construction Site Operators to Control Waste at the Site

Goal: Continue requirements for construction site operators to control waste at the site

Planning & Zoning and Inland Wetland Agency enforcement inspections currently ensure that all applicable regulations concerning waste control are followed.

11. Procedures for Site Plan Review

Goal: Continue site plan review procedures

The Town Engineer reviews all site plans for conformance to the Town's, state and federal requirements relating to construction site runoff control.

12. Procedures for Receipt and Consideration of Information Submitted by the Public

Goal: Continue procedures for receipt and consideration of information submitted by the public.

Information submitted by the public is forwarded to the appropriate Town department for consideration.

13. Procedures for Site Inspection and Enforcement of Control Measures

Goal: Continue site inspection and enforcement of control measures

Site inspection and enforcement of control measures are utilized on all of the Town's projects.

Section 5: Post Construction Site Runoff Control

1. Requirements for Structural and Non-Structural BMPs

Goal: Continue implementation of BMPs including projects with greater than or equal to 1- acre in disturbance area

The Town Engineer currently reviews plans to evaluate stormwater discharges and the methods that may be used for the treatment of stormwater before it reaches an outlet.

2. Procedures for Addressing Post Construction Runoff from Construction and Reconstruction Projects

Goal: Continue procedures for addressing post construction runoff from construction and reconstruction projects with greater than or equal to 1-acre in disturbance area

An internal memorandum issued to all Town departments requires stormwater management BMPs for all projects.

3. Ensuring Long Term Operation and Maintenance of Best Management Practices

Goal: Continue operation and maintenance of BMPs

The Public Works Department is responsible for the long-term operation and maintenance of the Town's facilities.

Section 6: Pollution Prevention / Good Housekeeping

1. Operation and Maintenance Program

Goal: Implement operation and maintenance requirements

The Town is continuing to identify the specifics of the training, record keeping, internal reporting, and maintenance that will be required as part of operation and maintenance plan related to stormwater management.

2. Employee Training Program

Goal: Develop employee-training curriculum

The Town's Public Works Department completed an annual training requirement in April 2012.

3. Street Sweeping Program

Goal: Implement street sweeping requirements.

The Public Works Department swept 100% of its roadways, approximately 120 miles, parking lots and facilities during 2013.

4. Catch Basin Maintenance Program

Goal: Implement catch basin maintenance requirements

The Town cleaned one thousand (1000) or thirty-eight percent (38%) of the Town's two thousand six hundred (2,600) catch basins in 2014. The Town's Public Works Department also continued using a comprehensive spreadsheet for tracking this information.

5. Preventative Maintenance Program

Goal: Implement preventative maintenance requirements

The Town conducts inspections as a part of new construction /reconstruction projects to identify existing drainage facilities that may be in need of repair or inadequate.

3.0 Monitoring Data

The SMRs for the Phase II (MS4) Stormwater sampling are included in Appendix I.

The town's PWG/Transfer station met its benchmarks after four semiannual sampling events and is no longer required to take samples until the General Permit is reissued in October 2016

4.0 Summary of Planned Stormwater Activities During the Next Reporting Cycle

Continued growth within the Town is being undertaken with an eye towards improving stormwater management. Developers who are working in areas where the existing stormwater infrastructure is not able to meet the needs of their planned construction are required to install or upgrade the stormwater infrastructure as part of their development.







Re: Annual Report for the Fiscal Year of July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2015.

The Oxford Water Pollution Control Authority is a five member appointed board responsible for administering the Water Pollution Control Statutes of the State of Connecticut and the Water Pollution Control Regulations of the Town of Oxford. The Authority meets on the last Wednesday of the month to review and act on applications submitted to the staff of the W.P.C.A.

The W.P.C.A. oversees all the sewers and pump stations. There is about 15 miles of public sewer lines in the town and 4 pump stations. There are 4 private sewer areas. In those areas there is about 13 miles of sewer lines and 11 pump stations. All the private sewage goes into the town's public sewers. The town has an agreement with Naugatuck for a 1,000,000 {gpd} of sewage and an agreement with Seymour for 250,000 {gpd} of sewage.

The Authority relies on the staff, Scott Halstead, to maintain all paperwork necessary for the files and to more effectively serve the public through out the work week. He also conducts all inspections on any sewer work in the town and all the town pump stations maintenance. The Authority has a clerk, Cynthia Peck, who does paperwork for the Authority. The Authority also employs the services of Nafis & Young Engineers to review all the technical aspects of complex applications.

Listed below you will find the activities for the Fiscal Year July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2015:

The Authority had 10 Regular Meetings, 4 Special Meetings including Public Hearings, and they processed 9 applications. All of the 9 applications were approved.

The Authority, through the W.P.C.A. staff, processed 105 building applications. Among those 105 applications, 45 were for Certificate of Occupancies. The W.P.C.A. staff worked 2,111 hours, conducted 233 inspections, and the maintenance of the pump stations. The sewage flow for the Fiscal Year was about 47,000,000 {gal}. There were 27 alarms set off at the pump stations and there was 1 by - passes of waste.

The Water Pollution Control Authority collected \$ 298,849.95 in town sewer user and hookup fees. The Water Pollution Control Authority annual budget for the Fiscal Year July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009 was \$ 698,403.

As the Town of Oxford moves into the future, the Authority anticipates further growth with more sewer areas and more pump stations. As a result, the work load and responsibility of the staff will increase.
