Capital Plan<br>Town Meeting<br>March 11, 2013

The Meeting was called to order at 7:00PM by First Selectman George Temple. Town Clerk Margaret A West read the call and return of posting.

First Selectman Temple nominated Gerard Carbonaro 14 Country Farm Rd, Seconded. There being no other nomination First Selectman Temple called for a vote.

## Nomination: Unanimous

Moderator Carbonaro read the eligibility to vote at town meeting found in section 3.2 of the town charter.

Item 1 Shall Town of Oxford approve the Capital Improvement Plan, as presented, per Section 3-4 of the Town of Oxford Charter and as approved by the Board of Selectmen on $3 / 6 / 2013$ ?

Discussion:
Finance Director reviewed the capital plan for the fiscal year 2013-2014. (Addendum A)

First Selectman George Temple commented that this is just a plan, he then reviewed a few of the items such as the center school play ground which could loss certification this year, further explaining that the playground will always be used even if we move the school
the system wide security for all of our schools, he is going to appoint an advisory committee and only he would be authorized to spend the funds allocated for this project, for which he expects to have the full support of the Board of Finance. With this project certain things will not be made public, because of security risk. The BOF will be kept advised at all times.

He continued with the Ambulance Corps saying that although there are items in this plan, he would support anything until he sees their books.

The library will be brought to a referendum vote, fly cars would be on an as needed basis. Parks and Recs utility truck is well over due. Public works SUV has to go to a lot of places and needs to be replaced. It was a condemned hand me down. I support all the PW vehicles and they should have stainless steel bodies.

Last year's road program was a great idea and it worked. Christian Street will be done with a $10 \%$ grant program. The town will only pay the 10 percent match. First Selectman Temple continued to review the 2013/2014 Capital Plan

John Barlow Facilities Manager for the Board of Education asked why the boilers were pushed back a year for Great Oak and Quaker Farms.

First Selectman Temple asked John to clarify whether they were changing them to gas or not. He further indicated that when they spoke he didn't' stress the urgency nor did he stress any safety issue. There was also no supporting documentation. FS Temple explained he could make a motion to amend the plan.

John Barlow made a motion to move the Quaker Farms "boiler replacement" for $\$ 80,000$ from FY14/15 to FY 13/14, seconded.

There being no discussion the moderator called for a vote:

## Amendment Carried Unanimous

John Barlow made a motion to move the Great Oak boilers for $\$ 130,00$ from FY $14 / 15$ to FY 13/14, seconded.

Amendment Carried: Unanimous
Selectman Haney and John Barlow continue discussion on the condition of the boilers regarding rebuilding or replacing.

Scott Pelletier, Fire Marshall/Fire Chief: explained that it takes over a year to get a new fire truck, if we put the order in this year we won't get it until
well into next year. It will not have to be paid for unit it comes in. The truck we have now is costly to keep it on the road because it is so old.

Ed Helliuer volunteer fireman who rides on the truck that would be replaced explained that this is an open truck and it is mighty cold when you are in the back. We are a volunteer company and it is good to give our hard working members good equipment. This truck is costly to maintain.

Scott Pelletier made a motion to move the fire truck for $\$ 644,000$ from FY 14/15 to FY13/14, seconded.

Amendment carried: Unanimous

Gerald Carboraro commented that he was in an accident in Westport and was brought to Norwalk Hospital, about a 10 minute ride. He received a $\$ 1300.00$ bill from the ambulance co. He wondered if our Ambulance Co billed out as well. FS Temple explained that Oxford does have some bill out practices, and that is why he is asking to see the books.

There being no other comments or questions Scott Pelletier moved to adjourn, seconded.
