Land record recording fees have been on an upward swing over the last 10 years and administering these fees is my job. My office collects the fees, processes the deeds and disburses the revenue created.

For each document there is a 40.00 Community Investment surcharge. 36.00 goes to the State Treasurer to be credited to an account for land preservation, 1.00 is retained by the Town Clerk, and 3.00 is retained by the town for Local Capital Improvements. This bill was heard by Planning and Development Committee, and the house debated and indicated that it was the intent of the legislature that the Town Clerk have discretion regarding the use of the clerks 1.00 fee for records management and related cost.

As for the 3.00 the intent would be that these fees would become part of the municipality general revenue and used to pay for projects that are eligible for funding under the LoCip program.

The 7,057.20 is coming from the Town of Oxford LoCip funds that the Town Clerks Office has collected from land records recordings.

There is also an additional 13.00 collected for each first page of each document. 10.00 goes into the general fund for the over all processing and storage and up keep of the records that have a forever life span and finally the last 3.00 is for the Historical fund, administered by the State Library. 2.00 for each document goes to the State library for Grant purposes, for which I have received many grant of the years for records management and the 1.00 stays here in a historical fund to off set grant projects and records management expenses. This all covered by CGS and makes the fee for recording all documents on the land records 53.00 for the first page and 5.00 for each page after that of each document.
